Publicity is the characteristic of the American Republic's proceedings. The deliberations of Congress (excepting those of the executive sessions and a few of the earliest legislative sessions of the Senate) have always been open to the public; early provision was made for the publication of an official journal of congressional proceedings, and the distribution of these to State officers and others began in 1814 (Res. of Dec, 1813); from these the Journal, Annals, Congressional Globe and Congressional Record have developed in succession. Before the adoption of the Federal Constitution, the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs was directed by a resolution of Congress "to obtain from the ministers and agents of the United States in foreign countries an abstract of their present state, their commerce, finances, naval and military strength, and the characters of sovereigns and ministers, and every other political information which may be useful to the United States" (Statutes at Large, I, 28). These reports have gradually expanded into the volumes on Diplomatic Relations and Commercial Relations published by the State Department (Statutes at Large, V, 507). The first censuses, those of 1790, 1800, and 1810, were mere enumerations of the constitutional population of the country with reference to military power and representation in Congress; the census of 1820 began the collection of statistics respecting industries and industrial products. The succeeding censuses have expanded, as increasing interest in the development of wealth, business, and population has made necessary, until the census of 1880 will be twenty times the size of the census of 1820.
